The Right Attitude in Prayer

• What is prayer?

Is the primary way for the believer in Jesus Christ to communicate his emotions and desires with God and to fellowship with God.

Where and in what manner should you pray?

Prayer can be audible or silent, private or public, formal or informal.

Why should you pray to God and not other gods?

The Lord God Almighty can do all things; there is nothing impossible for Him (Luke 1:37; Jeremiah 32:27).

 - Prayer to God should be made persistently Luke 18:1; 1 Thessalonians 5:17
 - in the name of the Lord Jesus John 16:23; 14:14
 - in the power of the Holy Spirit Romans 8:26; Ephesians 3:20; 6:18; Jude 1:20
 - with thanksgiving Philippians 4:6
 - in faith James 1:6; Hebrews 11:6
 - within the will of God Matthew 6:10; 1 John 5:14-15; Luke 22:42
 - for the glory of God John 14:13; 1 Corinthians 10:31; Romans 11:36
 - rom a heart right with God 1 John 1:9; James 5:16; Proverbs 28:13
 - in truth Psalms 145:18-19

The Right Attitude in Prayer
